


College and Career Readiness

In 2015-16, CHSD 155 will offer 25 different Advanced Placement (AP) courses. During the past several years, there has been a steady increase in AP course participation and exams taken. The percentage of honor scores earned on AP exams also remains high. For these reasons, CHSD 155 has been awarded AP District Honor Roll Status for the past three years; a recognition that most recently (2015) was limited to only 547 US and Canadian school districts.


AP exams are scored on an ascending scale from 1 to 5. The College Board considers honor scores to be a 3, 4, or 5. High school students are eligible for exempting out of certain college coursework based upon honor scores. For more information, click on the [link](#).


Percentage of Honor Scores Earned

Number of Students Taking AP Exams




College Savings: AP Coursework

As an example, an undergraduate 3-credit hour course at Northern Illinois University costs approximately \$1,870 (including tuition, general fees and expenses).

During the 2014-15 school year, CHSD 155 students earned AP honor scores of 3, 4, or 5 on 2,236 different exams which illustrates an estimated \$4,181,320 in savings to CHSD 155 families.

College Savings: Dual Credit Coursework

A recent partnership with McHenry County College (MCC) has resulted in dual credit opportunities for CHSD 155 students. Dual credit refers to high school students earning both high school and college credit for the same course. The courses reflect college-level rigor, but are taught by high school teachers who meet special criteria established by MCC.

Dual credit courses are currently offered in Music Appreciation, Computer Business Applications I, and Spanish IV. Tuition at MCC is approximately \$101 per credit hour. Dual credit courses are free to high school students who meet MCC course enrollment requirements. **This year, CHSD 155 students are estimated to earn \$373,892 in MCC college credit through this partnership.**
